The Flute of Lost Love

Review

There are many basic questions people will ask through the lifetime — and answers will never be found or with long experience you will create an answer in your head to find a harmony in life. In order to be happy a person needs certain knowledge of life and adaption to reality.

The Magic Flute material offers the noble research to life — philosophical and deep. I only do not know how very young audience can understand the complicated levels?

Watching the girls in primary colored costume and queer makes moving around the stage, illuminated and decorated with objets of new-fangled design, I felt a pleasant sensation of enjoying a collaboration of modern Italian fine art and dancing. Truth to say, I failed to follow the development of the story. Though it was said that this was based on the Magic Flute, I could find the seriousness of the original work: the adventures of the two boys, Papageno and Tamino, encountering with the monsters and seductresses were rather humorously depicted and they seemed to enjoy the adventures themselves. The speedy and energetic movements of the actors and actresses, as well as the sequences carried on in rapid tempo could catch the heart and mind of the audience and they were never felt tired all through the performance.

Slides, reminding us of Joan Miró, were effectively used to take the audience to the world of fantasy. Effective was the use of white cloth also. The idea of making a triangle from the cloth spread full on the stage, and making the queen stand on the top of it astonished the audience. The queen queening it over the girls was the highlight of the scene as symboling her charismatic character. Compared with this scene, I was doubtful if mid-air acrobatic performances and swings were requirements. I fully understand how difficult it was for the performers and the stage staff to carry the scene well, but I am sure that it was not so effective.

There are many divers elements in performing arts. I failed to catch the verbal message of this play exactly, yet I could enjoy the performance visually to the full. Though the music was of Mozart, yet the stage was of modern dance. Modernization of classics is a new idea worthy of learning. In the beauty and clarity derived from colors, I could find a typical character of 'Italiness'.
